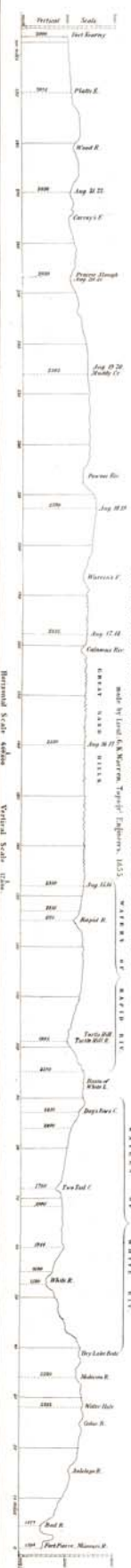


RECONNOISSANCES in the DACOTA COUNTRY
