Early voting ballots must be requested in writing. Electronic signatures will not be accepted.

Voting By Mail

Ballots will be mailed beginning April 4, 2022. Allow 5 days for mail delivery.

- ★ Ballots can be tracked at ne.gov/go/votercheck
- ★ If you plan to vote early by mail in future elections and would like the election office to mail you a postcard application prior to each election, check the box at the bottom right of the application that says "Please add my name to the Early Voting Request List."
- ★ Ballots are not forwardable. If your address changes, after you submit the application, you must contact the Hall County Election Office.

OTHER WAYS TO RECEIVE A BALLOT

Vote in Person at the Hall County Election Office

In person voting begins Monday, April 11, 2022 through Monday, May 9, 2022 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. weekdays.

Pick up a Ballot for Yourself or Another Voter

Ballots may be picked up beginning Monday, April 11, 2022 through Monday, May 9, 2022 for yourself or by 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 10, 2022 if you are acting as an agent for another voter. A voter may pick up his or her own ballot, plus may serve as an agent to carry the ballots for two other voters. A candidate or a member of a candidate campaign committee may only be an agent for his/her own family.

Ballot Return

Ballots must be returned to the Hall County Election Office at 121 S. Pine Street, Suite 8, Grand Island, NE 68801 or to the drop box located next to the east entrance door of Hall County Administration Building, 121 S. Pine Street. Deadline for return is 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 10, 2022. **Early ballots cannot be accepted at any polling site.**
